#### FORT SITE INTERPRETERS

For centuries, local legend had presumed that the original James Fort washed away into the river because of erosion and would never be found. Nevertheless, Dr. William Kelso challenged this long-held belief and, with the help of an outstanding team of archaeologists and researchers, they not only located James Fort, but have also unearthed over 3 million artifacts since the project began. Volunteer Fort Site Interpreters share this remarkable story and provide updates regarding our ongoing excavations with the visiting public.

#### ARCHAEARIUM MUSEUM DOCENTS
